Michael Bossetta


Michael Bossetta is a promising young researcher in political science and media studies, who has an impressive list of accomplishments across the four basic criteria that are highlighted by EYRA. His research findings on the fields of social media, politics and democracy in Europe are not only timely and relevant, but also carried out on a high level. Bossetta's work has led to a large number of publications in prestigious journals. He is active in his research environment and has organized several symposia and panel discussions at an international level. The EYRA jury also appraises his devotion for communicating the value of his research to the scientific community, the broader public and to policy-makers. His work has been portrayed in well-known journalistic platforms such as *New York Times, Financial Times* and *The Guardian*.

Valentina Sessini holds a Marie Curie postdoctoral scholarship at Alcalá University, Spain, after a postdoc position in Chemistry at Mons University, Belgium. Her PhD in Engineering was defended at Perugia University, Italy, in 2016, and for her BA and MA in Material Science she studied at Cagliari University and Sassari University, Italy, and at Menéndez Pelayo University, Spain, where she has also been an assistant researcher in 2017. She has received important grants and awards. Sessini's research interests focus on the development of bio-based materials and nanotechnology, which have provided her with the opportunity to be involved in broad European research networks. She has published ca. 20 peer reviewed articles and several book chapters in significant international outlets and has taken out a patent.

Sophus Helle is a writer, translator, and cultural historian. He holds a PhD in Comparative Literature from Aarhus University and an MA in Assyriology from the University of Copenhagen, and has been a visiting researcher at Universität Würzburg and Columbia University. He has published a Danish translation of the Babylonian epic *Gilgamesh*, which was praised by reviewers as "one of those miracles that makes life worth living"; his English translation of the same epic will appear with Yale University Press in early 2021. He specializes in ancient literature, especially the Babylonian epics, but his interests range widely, from the oldest poetry to present-day pop culture. His work has primarily focused on *Gilgamesh*; the poems of Enheduana, the first known author; the history of philology; and the historical study of sex, gender, and affect. He has 15 international articles to his name, including in leading journalists such as *Modern Language Quarterly, Journal of Near Eastern Studies and Orbis Litterarum.*

The winners of the 2019-2020 EYRA Popular Prize in Postdoc category are

María Viñas is a postdoctoral fellow at the Institute of Optics of the Spanish Research Council (IO-CSIC). Her B.S. and MSc in Optics and in Optical Engineering, and her PHD in Physics, also from Complutense University, have developed her ongoing research interests in Optics, which brought her a number of important grants and awards and have involved her in research collaboration in the USA and across Europe, both in research institutions and industrial research labs. Her research achievements lie within the development of Visual Optics and Biophotonics. María Viñas has published c. 40 international publications in high impact journals.
